



(Puss jumps on the parrot and holds him in his paws.)


Puss: Now I am going to eat you.

Parrot: You are a good cat. If you want to eat me, you must first



There is a storm in the jungle and the wind is blowing fast. It is


raining heavily. The birds and animals are inside their homes.

Tuk-Tuk calls all her friends. She calls the rabbit, the deer and the pigeon. They all collect twigs, leaves and feathers.





After sometime, an owl is flying by. It has a gem in its beak.




drops the gem and takes the snake in its beak and flies away. Sarika sees a spark in the dark. She goes near the spark.

In the morning, they take the gem to the queen. The queen is very happy. She gives a big toy shark to Sarika. Sarika is also happy. She plays with the shark.






