Ram had two donkeys. He used to put bags of goods on their backs. The donkeys would carry the goods to the hills. Their master sold these goods to people living in the hills.


One day, Ram was going on a trip to the hills. He put equal number of bags on both the donkeys. Ram did not know that one






donkey was ill. The ill donkey said to the other, 'Brother, I cannot carry this load.' The other donkey said, 'We have to do as our master says. This is our duty.'

After walking for sometime, the ill donkey became tired. He







There was a poor man called Raghu. So poor was he that some days he did not even have food to eat.



I will love him but when he is naughty, I will beat him. If he troubles me too much, I will take a stick and beat him hard.




Thinking he was beating his son, Raghu moved his hand in the air. Crash! The pot of wheat flour fell down and was smashed into hundred pieces.


